Promotion Policy and On-Track Credits

Grade level assignments beyond the freshman year will be determined strictly by the number of credits the student earns.

To be promoted to the next grade level:

- Freshmen must earn 5 credits including no less than 0.5 Core LA, 0.5 Core Math, and 0.5 Core Science
- Sophomores must earn 11 credits including no less than 1.5 Core LA, 1.5 Core Math, 1.5 Core Science, and 0.5 Core SS
- Juniors must earn 17 credits including no less than 2.5 Core LA, 2.5 Core Math, 2.5 Core Science, and 1.5 Core SS

Students will only be promoted at the end of the school year.
